

DMPC Performing Arts/Classical Variation Competition Official Rules 2024

TEACHERS ELIGIBILITY:

- 1. Members in good standing or a student of a member in good standing of Dance Masters Pacific Coast, Chapter #1 may enter the Performing Arts Scholarship Competition, provided that the member has complied with all of the rules, regulations, and requirements of the organization.
- 2. Non-Members may enter the Performing Arts Scholarship Competition for a maximum of 2 years. After such time, they must become a member to enter students in the Performing Arts Scholarship Competition
- 3. The "teacher of record" shall be the teacher whose signature appears on the competition applications, as the "teacher of record"
- 4. Only Member 'teachers of record' and students of members are eligible to attend DMA National Events. If the DMA Member 'teacher of record' cannot attend nationals then another DMPC member can replace that person as teacher of record.
- 5. Only Members "teachers of record" can enter a student in the DMPC Title Scholarship Competition
- 6. All other teachers(s) to be recognized shall sign as "teacher(s) of recognition" on the competition application.
- 7. Dues must be current and there must not be any outstanding debt to the chapter or the national organization. All dues must be paid in full by November 1st of the current fiscal year in order to be eligible to receive member benefits and pricing.

ENTRANTS ELIGIBILITY:

- 1. Entrants must have been enrolled, as a student, with the teachers of record for a minimum period of not less than ten months prior to the Chapter #1 Performing Arts Competition.
- 2. All Title entrants participating in any of this year's Solo Title Competitions may also participate in the solo category of the Performing Arts Competition with the exception of the new title winners. In the event of new title winner being registered for PAC, DMPC will fully refund the registration fee.

- 3. Only those entrants who have received platinum, high gold, gold, and high silver, from DMPC Chapter #1 Performing Arts Competition are eligible to compete at the DMA national convention.
- 4. Entrants who do not receive a platinum, high gold, gold, or high silver award may participate in the preliminary competition at the National Convention.
- 5. Any solo titled entry that received 80% of the total score for titles may compete in the National Finals at the National Convention with the exception of the Titled Winner.
- 6. DMPC Chapter #1 will not allow a 1st place solo/duo/trio/group/sm & lg line/extended or production routine to win more than one time in the same age division and/or dance category.
- 7. No entry, with exactly the same performers, will be permitted to compete against itself in the same category.
- 8. Entrants must be registered for the PAC Convention Saturday March 16, 2024. (The ages listed below are simply guidelines; a teacher may decide whether to place a particular student by age or ability. If a teacher decides to place a student based on ability, it will be done at the teacher's discretion only. *DMPC has the right to change age range of session based on enrollment*.
 - Mini Session ages 4-6 (as of June 1st 2024)
 - Petite Session ages 7-9 (as of June 1st 2024)
 - Junior Session ages 10-12 (as of June 1st 2024)
 - Teen Session ages 13-15 (as of June 1st 2024)
 - Senior Session ages 16 and up (as of June 1st 2024)

9. Divisions:

- Competitive (Novice) Category Dancers have had no more than 2 years training and have never competed before.
- Elite Category Dancers who have more than 2 years training and have competed before.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- 1. Videotaping or flash photography of any number will be strictly prohibited.
- 2. Infraction of any rule is subject to point deductions or disqualification.
- 3. Upon entry into this competition the entrants, parents of the entrants, "Teacher of Record", teacher of recognition and choreographers agree to the following:
 - All information submitted is correct and true.
 - The rules and regulations have been read by the "Teacher of Record", teacher of recognition, official chaperone, the entrant's parents and that all rules and regulations as stated or announced thereafter shall be adhered to.
 - That in consideration for acceptance into this competition, the DMPC, its officers and directors and the competition and convention facilities is hereby released from any claims or damages, or for any injuries, which the entrant might sustain while participating in any activity, connected with this convention or competition.

2. PAYMENT

3. AGE FOR COMPETITION

- A. Age Divisions: (age as of June 1, 2024)
 - 1. 5-6, 7-8, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16, 17-18, 19 and up, Pro-Am
 - 2. Pro/pro-am will be defined as a staff member employed by a dance studio to teach making 50% of their livable wage or a student whom receives more than \$10,000.00 per year as a teacher or a professional dancer or holding membership in a professional dance teacher's organization.
- B. Date for determining contestants' age for the performing arts competition is June 1, 2024.
- C. Determining the age of a duo/trio, group, line or production shall be accomplished by averaging the ages of all the dancers in the routine. Decimal points are to be dropped.
- D. A dancer may not compete in any age division that is more than one (1) age division lower than his or her own age division with the exception of the production category.

2. SUBJECTS

- Ballet*
- Pointe*
- Tap
- Jazz a form of dance that incorporates jazz technique
- Lyrical a form of dance that incorporates the interpretation of the lyrics of a song or the lyrical quality of the music
- Acrobatics / Gymnastics controlled and tumbling tricks movement

- Hip-hop stylized dance incorporating some jazz technique
- Contemporary a combination of modern or contemporary dance techniques
- Modern
- Musical Theater a dance style based on a Broadway or move musicals, may denote comedy, depict a character, relay a story or create a theatrical mood. Pantomime (lip sync) and singing permitted
- General Variety any routine that incorporates more than one dance form. Pantomime, lip sync and singing permitted.
- Open any routine that does not fit the descriptions of any subjects listed above
- Note 1: A routine that contains more than three (3) acrobatic tricks per person must be entered into either the acrobatics/gymnastics or general variety category.
- Note 2: Duo/trio, Group, Line, or Production routines with exactly the same students in them may not compete against themselves in the same subject unless 1 or more students have been changed, added or removed.
- Note 3: Only props that are a functional and integral part of the routine will be permitted.
- Note 4: Due to time restraints of the competition hotel/convention center storage space and hotel/convention center expenses for cartage and storage of scenery/ we must restrict the use of scenery that is not an integral part of the choreography and caution that all hotel/convention center and other expenses must be paid by the "Teacher of Record".
- *NEW All Classical Variations will be entered in our new Classical Variation Competition. All ballet solos with original choreography will be entered into the PASC Competition under the ballet or pointe categories.

8. MUSIC

- All music will be uploaded during registration online www.dma-chapter1.com
- Teachers must have back up of all music onsite.
- A five (5) second leeway will be permitted. There will be a one (1) point per-second penalty for music over the allotted time. Entrances and exits must be brief to avoid further penalties. All timing will begin with the first beat of the music and will terminate with the last beat of the music. If no music is used timing will begin with the first step of the routine of danced entrance step and will be terminated with the last step.
- Music with audible tap sounds on them will not be permitted for tap or clogging routines.

9. JUDGING

- A. Adjudicating for the Performing arts will be based on dance technique, performance and choreography. Medal Placement will be determined by performance score ONLY.
- B. Scoring will be as follows:

Platinum 285-300 points High Gold 270-284 points Gold 255-269 points High Silver 240-254 points

C. Qualified adjudicators will be used and all decisions will be final.

- D. Infractions of the rules will result in penalty point deductions from the total scores.
- E. That all entrants will follow the standards set by DMA. The standards are as follows:
 - Inappropriate or sexually suggestive movements should not be a part of any performance in any DMPC competition and should be evaluated as such and scores should be lowered accordingly.
 - Costuming such as thongs, bikini bottoms or tops that allow exposure of private body parts or that is not age appropriate, should be evaluated as inappropriate and should be evaluated as such and scores should be lowered accordingly.
 - Vulgar profane or suggestive language in music is not acceptable for our family audiences. Music that is not age appropriate or that carries a message that is not appropriate should be evaluated as such and scores should be lowered accordingly.
- F. DANCE MASTERS PACIFIC COAST reserves the right to disqualify from the competition any routine that is hazardous to the student or facility, inappropriate, vulgar, of sexually explicit nature, morally offensive or not upholding the standards of the DMPC.

- COMPETITIVE (Novice) ENTRY AWARDS (Technique, Performance, and Choreography): Dancers have had no more than 2 years training and have never competed before. PLATINUM - HIGH GOLD - GOLD - HIGH SILVER medals
- 3. ELITE TOP OVER ALL JUNIOR: (Technique, Choreography, Performance)
- 4. **ELITE TOP OVER ALL SENIOR**: (Technique, Choreography, Performance)
- 5. **ELITE OVERALL AWARDS** will be awarded as such:

1-3 entries1 overall4-5 entries2 overalls6-10 entries3 overalls11-15 entries5 overalls15-20 entries8 overalls21 entries and greater10 overalls

- There will be no ties for overall awards. Ties will be broken in the following manner:
- Performance scores of all adjudicators or:
- Decision of the adjudicators by secret ballot.
- Cash awards will be given only if there is a minimum of five (5) entries in a division.

NEW* DMPC CLASSICAL VARIATION COMPETITION**

Classical Variation Competition will be a new separate competition. This competition is strictly for classical variations. This choreography would have been done by choreographers that are deceased and whose work is in the public domain. Variations can be performed on the Pointe shoe or the soft ballet slipper. Dancers must be 12 or older to perform en pointe.

SCORING

The scoring will be based on performance, technique, execution, musicality and artistry. Each judge will score out of 100 points. Decision of the judges will be final.

AWARDS*

1st, 2nd, and 3rd Overall in each Age Division will be awarded

1st Overall will receive \$100 cash award if there are 5 or more entries

Participants are strongly encouraged to select a variation for the Classical Repertoire List below. If you choose to perform a variation that is not on the list below, please be aware that it will be at the discretion of each judge to determine if it is age and skill appropriate for the dancer.

TEACHER/PARENT RESPONSIBILITY:

The "Teacher of Record", chaperone and/or parent(s) shall be solely responsible for the following:

- The safety and well-being of the entrant during their stay at the convention/competition.
- The "Teacher of Record", chaperone and parent(s) if in attendance at the convention/competition shall; if the entrant is under 18 years of age, collectively assume all responsibilities for the entrants' behavior, entrant's attendance in class, the entrant's proper nourishment, and that the entrant is dressed and groomed properly for various events of the competition and convention.
- The "Teacher of Record", chaperone and parent(s) if in attendance at the convention/competition shall, if the entrant is over 18 years of age, assume not of the responsibilities listed in B above. The

entrant shall be considered an adult and shall be treated as such: and if found in violation of any of the rules and regulations stated or announced thereafter; or found not to be of good character, using foul language or engaging in any activity that is not upholding the standards of the DMPC, the entrant shall be punished as an adult and be expelled from the competition and/or convention.
